town of Khurmali. Bapir surrendered, and several days later was taken with other surviving members of his group to the town of Ranya. Bapir was subsequently re-arrested by U.S. military forces on July 10, 2003 for allegedly supporting Ansar al-Islam. After being lured to a private meeting at a resort hotel, Bapir and three aides were seized en route, handcuffed, blindfolded, and taken away in a U.S. helicopter. As of October 2004, Bapir remains in the custody of the American military. The World Assembly of Muslim Youth (WAMY) continues to fund numerous "charitable" projects in Iraq, reportedly totaling over \$200,000 in donations this year alone.
