Al-Qaida's Committee in the Islamic Maghreb Claims "The Battle of Shaykh Abul Baraa Ahmad"

February 13, 2007

"Al-Qaida's Committee in the Islamic Maghreb claims the battle of Shaykh Abul Baraa Ahmad."

"By the will of Allah, on Tuesday at 4:30 in the morning, the mujahideen were able to execute their holy attacks during which they exploded 6 vehicles targeting several apostate police stations. The mujahideen chose their targets precisely and timed the operations—along with employing guidance technology—to lessen any injury to fellow Muslims. The attack was a success and ended up destroying 5 fortresses for the apostates, in addition to killing and wounding more than 140 of them. The following [list] were the targets:"

"1.) The detonation of a car bomb [targeting] the apostate police headquarters for Boumerdas district, which resulted in the complete destruction of the building, killing and wounding at least 30 apostates."

"2.) The detonation of a car bomb [targeting] the apostate police headquarters for the Maqlaa' region (Tizi Ouazu), which resulted in the complete destruction of the building, killing and wounding at least 30 apostates."

"3.) The detonation of a car bomb [targeting] the apostate Al-Dirk center for the Si Mustafa local municipality, which resulted in the killing and wounding of at least 30 apostates."

"4.) The detonation of a car bomb [targeting] the apostate police station for the Thira' Ben Khadah (Tizi Ouazu) municipality, which resulted in the complete destruction of the building, killing and wounding at least 20 apostates."

"5.) The detonation of a car bomb [targeting] the apostate Al-Dirk center in Suk al-Hamad (Boumerdas) which resulted in the complete destruction of the building, killing and wounding at least 20 apostates."

"6.) The detonation of a car bomb at 10:30 am on that same day targeting the apostate police in the town of Bouhayr (Tizi Ouazu) after the vehicle was spotted [by police] and a team arrived in an attempt to dismantle the device. The explosion resulted in the killing and wounding of at least 10 apostates."

"In the event that the apostates attempt to cover up their massive losses, then we inform you that 5 apostate bases were totally destroyed and at least 140 were killed or wounded. Let the Interior Minister tell his lies to you, but their casualties are eyewitnesses to the cruel blows dealt by the soldiers of Islam. We inform the thieves and the French who follow the Christians and the Jews that the young Muslim men of the Maghreb are determined to liberate their homeland from every crusader, apostate, and co-conspirator..."



Abul Baraa Ahmad (a.k.a. Ahmad Zarabib), reported killed by Algerian security forces on January 17, 2006 in the mountains of the Bejaia province east of the capital Algiers. According to the Salafist Group for Prayer and Combat (now known as "Al-Qaida's Committee in the Islamic Maghreb"), Abul Baraa held rank as "the Chief of the Shariah Council and the Judiciary Council [of the GSPC] for many years and he is considered to be one of the co-founders of the GSPC."
